FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the Combined Charitable Campaign?

The campaign is an effort to consolidate all charitable campaigns into one, asking all City of Columbus employees for donations through payroll deductions or one-time gifts. That means there will be one drive at the work place—with minimal workplace disruption and administrative costs. There are multiple participating federations and hundreds of member charities from which employees can choose to support.

Which organizations participate in the combined campaign?

Sixteen federations (“umbrella” organizations for individual charities with similar missions) are eligible to participate in the 2010 campaign. Their member agencies represent a wide range of services that make a major impact on health human, educational, and environmental services.

On the following pages, you will find descriptions of the federations that have been approved to participate in the 2010 City of Columbus Combined Charitable Campaign.

Each federation is described briefly at the beginning of its listing. An address, phone number and web site (when available) are provided, so you may request more detailed information about the federation’s policies or member agencies. Individual agencies are listed beneath the federation heading in alphabetical order, with the corresponding agency code. Each agency’s administrative costs are noted in the description—those costs that are other than direct program services.

*The descriptive listing of the federations and their member charities appear in the resource guide in a rotating order each year for fairness.

What requirements must a federation meet (and are not limited to) to be eligible for inclusion in the campaign?

To be approved for participation in the City of Columbus Combined Charitable Campaign, federations must meet specified criteria which include, but are not limited to the following standards:

- Registered with the Attorney General’s office as a not-for-profit agency.
- Includes agencies which have boards of trustees, with members serving voluntarily.
- Employs standard accounting and financial reporting practices, including an external audit.
- Has non-discrimination policies in place and offers equal employment opportunities.
- Is a health and/or human service organization.

How can I direct my contribution to the agencies of my choice?

This resource guide lists all eligible federations and their member agencies.

Each federation and its agencies are listed separately with an assigned four-digit charity code. On your pledge card, you will use these codes to designate where you want your donor dollars to be used.

You may select up to FIVE federations or agencies.

If you do not designate your gift to a specific federation or agency, your donor dollars will be divided among all participating federations according to the percent of total designations received.

How do I make my contribution to the Combined Charitable Campaign?

Payroll deduction is the preferred giving method. It’s easy, convenient, and allows you to make your gift over a one-year period of time.

Deductions will be made from your paycheck, beginning with the first pay in January 2011.

What if I would prefer to give a “one-time” cash or check donation?

Contributions may also be made by cash, or by check, made payable to the Combined Charitable Campaign. These contributions must accompany a pledge card.

PLEDGE CARD COMPLETION

Directions: Clearly print all required information, using a black ballpoint pen ONLY.

1. Donor Information:

- a. Please FULLY COMPLETE the Employee information section at the top of the form. Include your agency/department name and agency/department number (if known), as well as your work phone number (this will only be used if we need clarification pledge information) in the designated spaces.
- b. If you wish to receive acknowledgement for your contribution, please complete the designated area marked: Home Address, City, State, and Zip code. To remain an anonymous donor, leave the home address fields blank.

2. Designation:

- a. To designate your gift to one or more (maximum of four) specific charities, enter the charity code and the annual amount for each designation in the spaces provided. Leave the charity code blank if you wish your donation to be processed as undesignated.
- b. Next to each 4-digit charity code indicate the total annual gift that you wish to go to each charity.
- c. Other Agency Designation: You may also make a gift to a qualified, central Ohio, tax exempt 501(c)(3) agency not listed in this guide. These agencies must meet the following criteria to be eligible to receive funds from the Franklin County Combined Charitable Campaign:
 - The agency must provide health and human services and provide proper documentation for approval.
 - The agency must be located in central Ohio.
 - The agency must be tax exempt 501(c)(3).
 - Governments, schools, and religious organizations are not eligible to receive designations.

Write in the name and address of the agency in the "Other Agency Designation" area and designate your gift to this agency on your pledge card in the space marked "5. Other Agency" (section 2).

3. Contribution Method:

- a. Please select one of the following contribution methods:
 - Payroll Deduction
 - One-Time Contribution (cash or check)
- b. Calculating Payroll Deduction: Multiply the total amount of funds you would like donated from your paycheck by the number of pay periods for the year (12) to calculate your total annual pledge. Please double check to make sure your total annual gift (section 3) amount matches the total annual pledge (section 2) specified in the "designation" portion of the pledge card!

EXAMPLE:

Charity Code	Annual Designation Amount
1234	\$50.00
2345	\$50.00
<u>3456</u>	<u>\$50.00</u>
(\$12.50/per pay)	= \$150.00 (Total Annual Gift)

NOTE: The minimum contribution for payroll deduction is \$2 per paycheck.

- c. One-Time Contribution: If you wish to give a one-time cash or check donation, indicate the amount, complete the charity designation portion of the pledge card (section 2), and attach your contribution to your pledge card. Make checks payable to the "Combined Charitable Campaign."

4. Signature and Anonymity:

- a. Signature: Be sure to sign and date your pledge card. Your signature authorizes your payroll deduction.
- b. Anonymity: If you would like your pledge to remain anonymous (you will not receive a "Thank You" from the charities which you choose to donate), please fill in the circle where indicated to the right of the signature box and **do not** complete the home address fields in the Donor Information section.

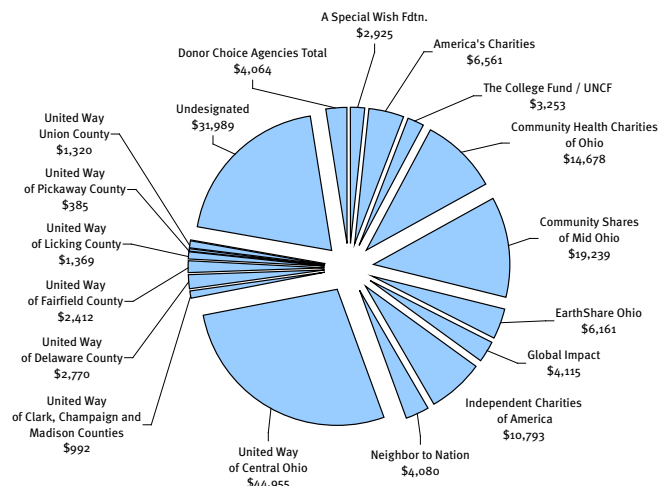




